



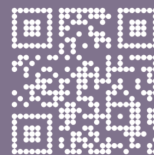

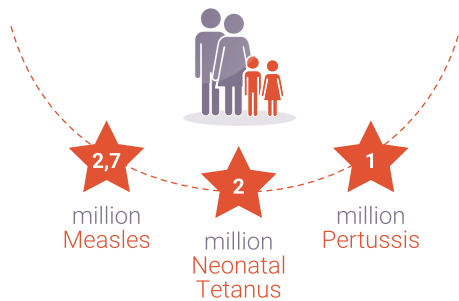
WHY do we need a European Joint Action on Vaccination?

> **15 000** measles cases across European Union in 2018 (Source *WHO Europe*)

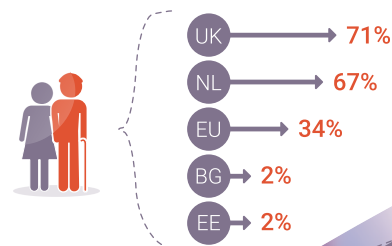


2) VACCINATION SAVES LIVES



Cases prevented worldwide every year

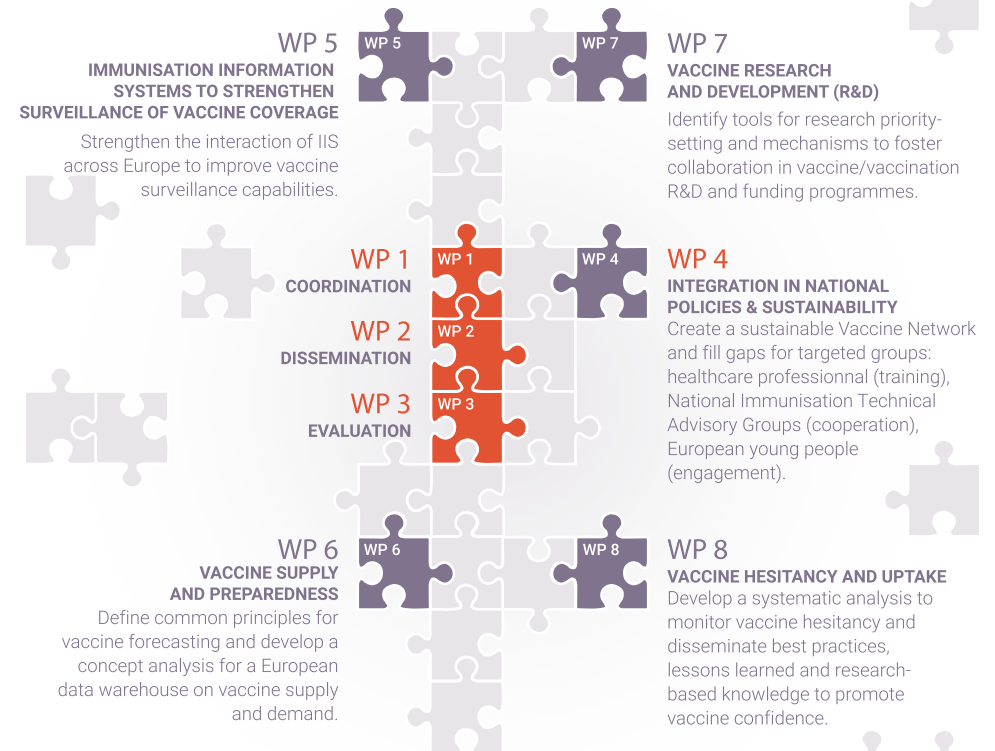
3) VACCINATION COVERAGE INFLUENZA AGE 65+

THE OBJECTIVE OF EU-JAV IS
